Revelation: Seven More Interludes

Lesson 22

Interlude #1: The Woman And The Beast

- Revelation 17:1-18
 - I will show you the punishment of the great prostitute who sits on many waters.
 - Committed adultery with all of the kings and inhabitants of the earth
 - The reference to Babylon the great inn v 2 is nearly identical to the one inn Revelation 14:8 in which the nations are caught in her seductive web of luxury, idolatry, depravity, and brutality.
 - The woman was in the desert, riding on a scarlet beast with seven heads and ten horns covered with blasphemous names. (Do you think this is the end times beast????)
 - Satan is never called "the beast" in Scripture. This beast, which we first encountered in Revelation 13:1-2 is so possessed by the evil one that when he comes on stage his reign is utterly diabolical.
 - That the beast is now scarlet may indicate he has fully assimilated the nature of the red dragon of Revelation 12:3
 - The woman was gorgeously arrayed in regal colors and glittered with gold and jewels.
 - In her hand was a golden cup filled with abominations and filth.
 - Notice her title written on her forehead
 - The woman was drunk on the blood of the saints she murdered in her hatred of truth and righteousness and her glorification of evil.
 - The nations she controlled likely became her accomplices in savaging the followers of Christ. (V 6)

Interlude #1: (2) Mystery: Babylon The Great

Revelation 17:3

- Description of Babylon the Great could symbolize the anti-God political/religious spirit ruling the world down through the ages.
- However, <u>Revelation 17:18</u> identifies the woman as the "great city that rules over the kings of the whole earth".
 - A rebuilt, restored Babylon
 - Another great city
 - An anti-God governmental or religious system of the end times
 - Could have a double meaning.
 - Babylon the Great is probably the capitol city of the seventh world empire that "has not yet come." (Revelation 17:10)
 - Bottom line: The "Babylon the Great" spoken of in this passage will one day assert her influence over the whole world and implement vicious anti-Christian laws and practices. (Revelation 17:6)

Interlude #1: (3) The Beast Once Was, Now Is Not, And Yet Will Come

- Read Revelation 17:7-8
 - When John was shown the prostitute, he was greatly astonished.
 - To help John unravel the mystery of the prostitute the angel pointed to the beast the prostitute was riding. (Note: the prostitute and the beast have separate identities.)
 - John was told the beast the prostitute was riding on "once was" (in former times)
 - "now is not" (in John's time)
 - "And yet will come" (future time)
 - The unredeemed world will be astonished when they see the beast who once was, but now is not, revived for a short time.
 - Note this passage states three times that the best 'once was, now is not, and yet will come."
 - This is the second clue to the beast's identity that is quite compatible with the first clue: a beast with seven heads, one of which seemed to have a fatal wound, but the fatal wound has been healed. (Revelation 13:3)

Interlude #1: (4) Seven Heads – Seven Kings


- Revelation 17:9-10
 - John is told the seven heads are seven kings five have fallen, one is, and the other is yet to come.
 - John was told that the seven heads of the beast the woman was riding signified seven hills and seven kings.
 - Nothing further is said about the hills.
 - V 10 states that five have fallen (former kings or kingdoms),, one is (present kingdom: Rome), and the other (7th) has not yet come (Future king or kingdom)
 - When the seventh king/kingdom does come, he will rule for a little time.
 - Note that the explanation of the seven kings provides a third clue to the identity of the beast -- a perspective that is different, yet not at odds with the beast
 - WHOSE FATAL WOUND WAS HEALED
 - ONCE WAS, NOW IS NOT, AND YET WILL COME
 - Revelation 17:10 does not necessarily indicate that the 7th king, the one yet to come, is a revival of
 one of the first five kings.

Interlude #1: (5) The Beast Is An Eighth King

• Revelation 17:

- The beast whose seven heads represent seven kings, the 7th of which is yet to come, is also an eighth king who belongs to the seven.
 - This means the beast not only epitomizes the seven beast kingdoms in composite (<u>Revelation</u> 13:2) but also functions as an eighth king who belongs to the seven and is headed for destruction.
- The seven-headed beast reaches its end apex in the eighth king.
- Thus the eighth king furnishes us a 4th clue to the beast's identity.
- The beast is an eighth king who proceeds fro/arises after a future 7th kingdom.

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Interlude #1: (6) The Ten Horns

Revelation 17:12-14

- The ten horns are ten kings who will receive lesser kingdoms and will join their authority and power to the beast for one short hour.
- Little information is given as to the identity of the ten kings, but since the beast as the "little horn," comes up among the ten horns of the Roman Empire (Daniel 7:24), it seems likely the ten horns who pledge aallegiance to the beast are the same nations once controlled by Rome (most of which are now under Muslim rule excluding, at present, Greece, and Israel.
- The beast and his coalition of ten nations will wage war against the Lamb, but the Lamb will overcome them because of Who he is the Lord of lords and King of kings.

Interlude #1: (7) The Ten Horns

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Interlude #2: The Fall of Babylon

- Revelation 17:15-18
- The prostitute's power and authority are global
- The waters she sits on are peoples and nations
- Up to this point it appears the woman and beast she is riding on are enmeshed. But ...
 - The beast (8th king) and his ten confederates hate the prostitute
 - Turn on the prostitute
 - Bring the prostitute to ruin
 - Leave the prostitute naked
 - Eat the prostitute's flesh
 - Burn the prostitute with fire
- Apparently, in order to attain a stranglehold on the world and set himself up as God (<u>2 Thessalonians 2:4</u>), the 8th king, in collusion with the ten kings, will subdue everything that stands in his way including the prostitute ruling the earth (V <u>15-16</u>).
 - The 8th king's fiendish objective is to remove her from power, gain control, force global submission and demand worship. (Revelation 17:15, 13:7-8)
 - The reason the ten kings hand their power to the beast is because God planted this plan IN THEIR Hearts in order to bring His plan to completion.

Interlude #3: Hallelujah In Heaven

- John hears a great multitude in heaven shouting "Hallelujah" God's people celebrating:
 - The righteousness and justice of God.
 - For judging the great prostitute who corrupted earth
 - Avenging the blood of His servants.
- The 24 elders and four living creatures join in
- A voice from the throne exhorts all God's servants to praise Him and they do
- The wedding supper of the Lamb has come.
 - The bride of the Lamb is given bright, clean linen to wear which symbolizes lived righteously
 - Those invited (his bride) to the wedding supper of the Lamb are blessed.
 - This wedding symbolizes the bride (us) being joined to the Lord forever.
 - (Acts 1:11)
 - The redeemed will always be present with Jesus (<u>1 Thessalonians 4:16-17</u>)
 - Compare the jubilation of the bride to the wretched state of the lost on the day "he comes to be glorifi3ed in his holy people (2 Thessalonians 1:6-10a)

Interlude #4: The Rider On A White Horse

- The rider, whose name is Faithful & True, The Word of God (John 1:1, 14) and a name he alone knows, rides out to judge and punish defiant mankind.
 - His eyes are afire
 - Crowned with many crowns
 - Dressed in a blood-soaked robe (Isaiah 63:2-3)
 - From Crucifixion or from rebellious humanity
 - Behind him follow the armies of heaven riding on white horses and dressed in white linen (possible of the wedding apparel of the bride) (Revelation 19:8)
 - A Sharp sword issues from his mouth to strike down the nations and destroy the wicked.
 - His wrath is terrible (<u>Isaiah 11:4</u>, <u>2 Thessalonians 2:8</u>)
 - On his robe and on his thigh is written "King of Kings And Lord of Lords"
 - Review Revelation 19:11-16 And Revelation 17:14

Interlude #4: The Rider On A White Horse (2)

Armageddon

- The beast and the kings of earth and their armies mass at Armageddon to fight against the rider and his armies (Revelation 16:12-16)
- There is no contest.
- The beast, the false prophet were captured and thrown alive into the fiery lake of burning sulfur
- The rest of the 200,000,0000 army were killed with the sword from the rider's mouth
- The Great Supper of God takes place.

Supper of God

- An angel summoned all the birds in midair to eat the flesh of kings and generals, horses and riders, free men and slaves, small and great
- The great supper of God, which undoubtedly relates to the great final battle at Armageddon, appears to take place, after the wedding supper of the Lamb (<u>Revelation</u> 19:9, <u>Ezek 39:17-20</u>)

Interlude #5: The Thousand Years

Dragon Chained

- An angel seizes the dragon (aka ancient serpent, the devil, and Satan) nd chains
- Angel throws Dragon into the Abyss, locked and sealed it to prevent the Devil from deceiving the nations for a thousand years.
- After a thousand years, the Devil will be set free for a short time to once again deceive the mankind.
- Why: Possibly to unequivocally demonstrate the intractable fallen nature of man.

Thousand Year Reign

- Those given authority to judge were seated on thrones
- The souls of those who had been beheaded
 - Because of their stand for Jesus and because they had not worshipped the beast's image or received his mark came to life
 - They are blessed and holy
 - Reign with Jesus and serve as priests of God for a thousand years.

Interlude #6: Satan's Doom

- At the end of the thousand years, Satan will be released to go out and deceive the nations of the earth – God and Magog
- Gather the nations once again, to attach and overthrow Christ's kingdom
- These forces, as numberless as sea sand, will march across the earth and surround Jerusalem
- But...fire will come down from heaven and consume them.
- Notice there is no indication of battle here.
- The devil will be thrown into the "fiery lake of burning sulfur" to be tormented forever – along with the beast and false prophet. (<u>Revelation</u> <u>19:20</u>)

Interlude #7: The Dead Are Judged

The Great White Throne

- John saw the Lord seated on a great white throne (not informed where i.e. Earth and sky have fled away)
- The Books are opened
- The Sea, death and Hades gave up the unsaved dead for judgment
- Each person sentenced in accordance with his works as recorded in the books that were opened.
- Believers do not stand before this throne.
 - They already have eternal life (<u>1 John 5:11-13</u>)
 - They already have passed from death to life (John 5:24)
 - They already have experienced resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:51-52)
 - They already have become a kingdom and priests to serve God (Revelation 1:6)
 - Some are already the bride of Christ

Death and Hades destroyed

- Death, Hades and all whose names were not found written in the book of life were thrown into the lake of fire.
- For believers, the second death holds no threat.
